



Dr. L.P. Agarwal started his work at Moorfields and the associated Institute of Ophthalmology in September 1946 and has been closely connected with it up to the present time.

Of all the Indian postgraduates who have been at Moorfields since the war, there has been no keener man, no man who has done better in his examinations or worked harder to gain experience in every branch of the subject. I have seen much of his work and his keenness and have examined him. His record of achievement I need not repeat, but I speak in the highest terms of his clinical interest, of his search for new aspects and other causes and treatment in any particular morbid state. His research has been particularly directed towards retinal detachment, one aspect of which, the common double balloon formation, he has investigated, and, as far as I know, this has not been done by anyone before.
